The Intake unit will review the application and determine if the claim can be forwarded to our Investigative unit. The Investigative unit will then determine eligibility, process the claim according to statutes and forward to supervisors for final review and approval.

The agency's Intake Unit works closely with the FBI and Federal victim advocates to serve federal crime victims. The Agency's staff also are members of the Human Trafficking Task Force which allow collation with Federal and State agencies.

The office continued to incorporate technology initiatives in order to improve our victim compensation services to victims, providers and advocates. In late 2018, an ambitious outreach effort was launched to distribute materials to all police departments and hospitals within the state.
