NARRATIVE QUESTIONS

1. Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.

The California Victim Compensation Board (CalVCB) received 14.4% fewer applications during the reporting period compared to federal fiscal year 2018-19. The significant decrease was likely the result of Governor Newsom's March 19, 2020 statewide shelter-in-place order imposed because of the COVID-19 pandemic. It is suspected that many domestic violence and child abuse cases went unreported since that time. Additionally, violence crime rates may have declined while people adhered to stay-at-home orders. Compounding those impacts is that victim witness advocates in District Attorney Offices transitioned to remote operations. Normally advocates are available to assist victims with completing and submitting CalVCB applications in person. This resulted in fewer opportunities to interact with crime victims and assist with the CalVCB application.

2. The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The average processing time is calculated from the day the application is received by mail, fax, email, or online portal to the day the eligibility recommendation is made. Upon receipt applications are scanned into CalVCB's claims management system. Application intake staff perform data entry, verifies all pertinent fields of the application are complete and that some form of crime documentation has been received. If pertinent fields are incomplete, or if required documentation is missing, staff calls and writes the applicant to request additional information. Lastly, eligibility determination staff review crime reports or other documentation to ensure there is a qualifying crime and makes allow or deny recommendations accordingly.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

CalVCB works closely with advocates from the FBI Victim Assistance Program and other federal agencies to help them assist victims of federal crimes, including mass violence events that occur in California or where a large number of California residents are involved. CalVCB has a Mass Violence Response Team and a Mass Violence Response Plan to quickly mobilize if mass violence events occur. CalVCB also works with the International Terrorism Victim Expense Reimbursement Program (ITVERP). One CalVCB staff member has been designated as the single point of contact for ITVERP and regularly communicates with the program when California citizens are victims of terrorism outside the United States.

6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

CalVCB developed an advocate portal to enable victim advocates to help facilitate the electronic application submission process via CalVCB Online. CalVCB Online is a secure and private portal that can be easily accessed from a phone, tablet or computer. With CalVCB Online victims can: Apply for compensation Upload and submit documents Communicate with CalVCB The advocate portal allows advocates to view and track applications in-process for the victims they represent. A pilot project was rolled out to a few counties in September 2020 and the official advocate portal rollout is planned for federal fiscal year 2020-21. Effective July 13, 2020, CalVCB underwent an organizational restructuring to better address business needs and to improve customer service and processing time. As a result, additional processing teams were created, and staff and workflows were reorganized to enhance service delivery.

Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

The VOCA Administrative funds were used to partially fund three contracts with local processing offices in Los Angeles, San Bernardino and Riverside. These offices processed approximately 22% of all applications during the reporting period. These offices are primarily based in District Attorney's offices throughout the state and are instrumental in helping CalVCB meet the needs of victims given the large geography and population of California.

8. Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

Yes, there were two programmatic changes due to legislative changes. The filing period for new applications was extended, giving victims more time to address crime-related loss. New applications filed on or after January 1, 2020 can be filed within: Seven years of the date of the crime, or Seven years after the victim attains 21 years of age, or Seven years of the time the victim or derivative victim knew or in the exercise of ordinary diligence could have discovered that an injury or death had been sustained as a direct result of crime, whichever is later. As a result of California Government Code 13957.5(a)(5), for applications received on or after January 1, 2020, a victim or derivative victim of sex or labor trafficking may be eligible for wage compensation directly resulting from the deprivation of liberty during the crime. CalVCB may award wage compensation

to human trafficking victims for an amount up to \$10,000 per year for a maximum of two years. Weekly compensation is calculated using the California statewide minimum wage rate at the time of the crime, with a maximum of 40 hours per week. The payments are non-taxable. If the victim has or will receive wage compensation from any other source, that amount must be considered as a reimbursement source. Payments cannot be made to a victim who is currently a minor. Payments will be made after the victim reaches the age of 18. If the victim is deceased, the shared benefit may be paid to a spouse or dependent.

9. Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

CalVCB was awarded two victim assistance grants from the California Governor s Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES). Through the Improvement to Delivery of Victim Services Program grant, CalVCB will use nearly \$1,600,000 to embark on several projects to improve services to victims. The activities of the grants are to increase public awareness of compensation benefits, including creating and distributing toolkits for service providers throughout the state, hiring a consultant to develop a targeted marketing plan to reach underserved victims, creating eLearning modules to teach the public and victim advocates how to use CalVCB s online application, redesigning the CalVCB website, and hiring five victim advocates liaisons to provide outreach to victims and connect them with appropriate resources and referrals. The Increased Access to Services Program grant was awarded to CalVCB in the amount of \$125,000 to create outreach to victims who have limited English proficiencies and communicate in a different language. Work completed through this grant will also improve accessibility to victims of crime who live with visual impairments by means of adapting, translating and distributing applicable outreach materials.

10. Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.

During the state fiscal year 2019-2020 CalVCB distributed over 78,000 pieces of material to stakeholders. Stakeholders statewide requested publications to distribute to their clients. CalVCB s one-page fact sheet in English and Spanish was the most frequently distributed publication. This publication provides information about how to access CalVCB, eligibility for compensation, and available benefits. Additionally, as the recipient of a Cal OES grant to increase awareness about services to victims, CalVCB distributed toolkits with publications to providers and stakeholders throughout California. Lastly, CalVCB staff participated in or made presentations at public events and virtual forums throughout the course of the reporting period. CalVCB provides training to criminal justice system-based and community-based victim advocates. Webinars are held each month focusing on a different topic, such as relocation or funeral benefits. CalVCB facilitates informational webinars for mental health providers twice a month. The forums topics rotate between billing procedures and CalVCB documentation. They provide continual training and address mental health providers questions about victim compensation. CalVCB completed several online outreach efforts during the reporting period to increase awareness of CalVCB, including through social media, such as Facebook, Twitter and YouTube.
