There was a slight decrease in the number of claim applications received during the reporting period due in part to the Corona Virus pandemic and the subsequent closures of some North Carolina court systems. However, with the phased re-opening an uptick in claims has occurred.

2. The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The North Carolina Crime Victim Compensation Program processes claims in the order received and date stamped upon intake. The process involves: Intake - claim entered VC case management data base and an open letter is mailed to victim/claimant; Distribution - when all needed material is in file, the claim is distributed for investigation, if additional materials are needed, the claim is distributed for information request; Investigation - claim submitted for investigation to determine eligibility; Recommendation - award-claim is transferred to financial examination, denial-claim is transferred to Director / Commission; Examination - expenses are reviewed for payment or denial, award-claim is transferred to Director / Commission determines award or denial, award-claim is submitted to fiscal for payment, letter of determination to victim/claimant, denial-letter of determination to victim/claimant.

^{4.} Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.

The Corona Virus pandemic has impacted the state. It remains to be determined what the overall impact it will have on victims of crime. Reports are that the stay-at-home orders may result in increased instances of domestic violence as many victims have no place to go for safety.

^{5.} Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

Crime victims were referred to federal victim and criminal justice system agencies if warranted. Additionally, education materials were made available to various victim service agencies to provide to victims and claimants. The program assists all eligible victims.

6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

In person education and outreach events were prohibited and cancelled due to response to the Corona Virus Pandemic. However, the Director provided virtual trainings via Webex and MS Teams to the Conference of DA's, NC VAN; the training information was provided to various victim service agencies, law enforcements and other stakeholders. Topics covered included information for the agencies to provide to victims regarding applying for compensation and rape victim assistance. Additionally, Crime Victim Compensation Commission members, as well as, victim compensation staff members participated in the 2020 National VOCA Conference virtually.

7. Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

The crime victim compensation positions supported by VOCA Administrative Funds provide victims with compensation information regarding claim applications, claim processing and resource information. Also provided is financial review and check preparation which is vital to getting reimbursement to victims in a timely manner to aid in reducing trauma and anxiety incurred as a result of the violence suffered.

No changes.

The Victim Compensation Commission works collaboratively with the above agencies. Education regarding how victims are notified of the compensation program is ongoing throughout the year, as well as, access to online information via the NC DPS Victim Services website. Also, the above agencies are contacted regarding information requested during crime victim claim processing to aid with claim eligibility determination.

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Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.

In person education and outreach programs were cancelled due to the Corona Virus Pandemic. However, compensation program brochures were mailed to victims/claimants upon request. Additionally, brochures and education materials were mailed throughout the state to victim service agencies, law enforcement agencies, DA offices, and other community stakeholders.
