1. Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.

Due to the pandemic, we had periods of time where we were well below average in the number of claims received. We believe this was due to many of the agencies who notify victims of the program, and assist them with completing the application were shut down for a period of time.

2. The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Once an application is received through web application, mail, email, or fax it is assigned a claim number and a claim investigator. The claim investigator reviews the application and sends and acknowledgement to the applicant that it is either complete or we need further information. Once we have the complete application and signed release, the program obtains the relevant police report and criminal history. When all relevant information is received the claim is submitted for review at which point a notice of award or denial is issued.

3. Does your state have a victim satisfaction survey?

Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.

The major issue for the program is the lack of funding. Revenue from the State's court has steadily declined and the COVID pandemic has only exacerbated this issue which then results in diminishing federal matching funds.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

We partner with the victim specialists in the FBI and US Attorney's local offices, and attend regular meetings with them.

6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

We have been out in the community more, and created a "mobile office" where we can set up at an off site location and fully process applications. We have been able to answer more questions directly and assist in completing applications by going to places we know victims frequent such as police stations, courts, hospitals, and welfare offices.

Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

We have shifted away from using VOCA Administrative funds for salary. We intended to use this money for training, conferences, and operations costs. However, with the COVID pandemic impacting training and travel, and the declining revenue all of our grant funding is being used for claim payouts.

We have strong partnerships in the private sector with many victim service agencies, as well as most police departments within the state, and the attorney general's office. We are in constant communication with them and both attend and host training sessions to learn more about what they do, and so they can learn more about our program to help them feel more empowered with their victims to navigate the process. We also take on most of the burden of document gathering ourselves to make the process as seamless as possible for victims

10. Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.

In addition to our mobile office implementation prior to the pandemic, the program has also been offering regular "zoom" trainings to agencies in the public and private sectors.
