We saw a large decrease in claims and bills when Covid started taking effect in March. it stayed low through April and May, then started rising in July. the numbers are now higher than in the spring, but still a little lower than before Covid.

There always seems to be a lot of turnover. And this year, we had to make major adjustments to allow people to work from home most or all the time. This slowed things down for a while, but we have pretty well solved this now.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

We work with Victim Witness Coordinators at the federal level to obtain crime reports on a timely basis.

6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

We look for ways to make us more efficient, especially with the computer system. We have also increased outreach in recent years.

7. Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

We do not use any VOCA funds for administrative costs. All funds go to benefits.

8. Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

We had paid for physical assault exams for minors when there was suspicion of child abuse. This benefit expired in 2019. This benefit was legislatively restored for the 2020-2021 biennium. Wage loss for parents who take their minor children to medical/mental or criminal justice appointments was implemented. The period to file claims timely increased from two years to three years.

9. Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

During Legislative session (January thru April), we meet weekly with stakeholders to discuss proposed bills and other issues. We also have regular training sessions and work with prosecutors at all levels to obtain police reports on a timely basis. We also work closely with prosecutors to award restitution to CVC for claim cost, thereby holding offenders responsible for the costs.

10. Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.

Our program participates in several victim services committees such as the Department of Corrections victim counsel, which is a group of system and community based advocates and state programs to discuss victim needs and barriers to services. We provide outreach to any advocacy group wanting formal training or informational meetings about our program. We participate in statewide events to bring knowledge of our program to the public, such as national night out, and having a stand at the educational pavilion at our state fair. Since March 2020, we have all been finding different ways to meet the needs of victims, while working during a pandemic. Our staff has worked with our stakeholders in order to meet training and education needs in a virtual environment.

We measure average days from bill received to bill paid. For Federal Fiscal Year 2020, the average was 24 days. We dedicated extra effort to reducing the backlog in December 2019, and this has improved the payment process. As stated above, we continue to have a lot of turnover, and much of this is in the bill paying unit. We continue to train new employees.
