Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The North Carolina Crime Victim Compensation Program processes claims in the order received and date stamped upon intake. The process involves: Intake - claim entered VC case management data base and an open letter is mailed to the victim/claimant; Distribution - when all needed material is in file, the claim is distributed for investigation, if additional materials are needed, the claim is distributed for information request; Investigation - claim submitted for investigation to determine eligibility; Recommendation - award-claim is transferred to financial examination, denial-claim is transferred to Director / Commission; Examination - expenses are reviewed for payment or denial, award-claim is transferred to Director / Commission, denial-claim is transferred to Director / Commission; Determination - Director / Commission determines award or denial, award-claim is submitted to fiscal for payment, letter of determination to victim/claimant, denial-letter of determination to victim/claimant.

As this state and others continued to navigate through the Corona Virus Pandemic, per statute, claim applications must be signed and notarized which may have hampered some victims; finding a notarizing official may have presented a challenge.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

The program assists all eligible victims. Education materials were made available to the courts and victim service agencies to provide to victims and claimants. Victim Services staff participated in virtual training opportunities the ensure the public were provided information regarding the programs available to them.

Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

Although, in person education and outreach opportunities continue to be prohibited due to the Corona Virus Pandemic, several virtual trainings occurred during the reporting period both for external victim service providers and stakeholders, as well as, for Victim Compensation team members.

Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

VOCA Administrative funds provide for crime victim compensation positions utilized to provide support to victims by assisting with information regarding claim application and processing procedures. Additionally, providing information to services providers who may be assisting victims.
