1. Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.

Early in the performance period we received nearly double the applications we normally receive. The number of applications leveled by the end of the first quarter and then picked back up again and we are estimating we will receive more applications in the remainder of the calendar year than we've had since 2016. We believe our new online application system is really helping to improve the ease of completing an application.

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The largest majority of our applications are received through our online application system. Once received, the application is reviewed to ensure it's complete. We then request LE information. Once the LE information is returned a final check on the application is completed by admin staff. The application is then routed to the Program Manager for review and approval/denial. Depending on the circumstances in the application it's possible additional information may be needed prior to a decision being made.

We have an excellent working relationship with our Federal victim witness advocates. They are included in our communications and we have regular contact with them regarding status on claims or cases.

The biggest achievement to report is the launch of our online application system. This has greatly improved our efficiency in processing applications. We have reduced the number of days for us to review and approve/deny applications. Our new online application is accessible from any computer, tablet, or mobile device making it much more accessible than the old paper application. The application is also simplified allowing victims to complete the application guicker.

North Dakota did not use any administrative funds from our grant.
