Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Upon receipt of the application, we contact the victim/claimant to acknowledge receipt, obtain any additional information we may need, determine safest way to send correspondence, and explain next steps. We then request the relevant police reports, and victim's State criminal record. Once we receive, the claim is submitted for a decision. Once the decision is made, we send a letter with the decision, and next steps via regular and certified mail, or email if this is the preferred contact method.

4. Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.

The biggest issue since the beginning of the pandemic has been the victim's ability to find affordable housing. Our relocation program is robust, but when a victim who often lacks high credit scores, or high enough income is seeking a new apartment to flee an abuser they have reported great difficulty in securing housing which they can afford after our relocation benefit has reached the maximum award. We are able to pay the first 2 months rent plus security deposit up to the HUD fair market rent value for the area. Unfortunately, most available housing is significantly higher than the HUD fair market rent amount as well.

^{5.} Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

We partner with the victim specialists in the FBI and US Attorney's local offices, and attend regular meetings with them.

6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

We have continued our outreach activities to include trainings for law enforcement agencies, hospitals, and local non profit and victim service agencies. This has helped to keep us top of mind when these partners encounter victims who may qualify for our services.

Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

We have used the VOCA Administrative funds to pay claims. We initially anticipated the return of in person conferences and noted in our application that the administrative funds would be used for travel and training. However, with most conferences still taking place virtually we have not used any VOCA funding for this purpose.

We have strong partnerships in the private sector with many victim service agencies, as well as most police departments within the state, and the attorney general's office. We are in constant communication with them and both attend and host training sessions to learn more about what they do, and so they can learn more about our program to help them feel more empowered with their victims to navigate the process. We also take on most of the burden of document gathering ourselves to make the process as seamless as possible for victims.

We routinely offer trainings both virtually and in person to many local law enforcement and victim service agencies.
