A change in administration, in addition to staff turnover, may have slowed processing time periods, while policies were under review. However, staff have done an exemplary job at covering empty caseloads to alleviate any impact on victims.

Routine training and outreach to all entities serving victims, federal or otherwise. Our office has a good working relationship with both the Northern and Southern US Attorney's Office as well as the Victim Witness Coordinators in these offices. The Victim Assistance Section also has connections with the FBI victim specialist for the State of Iowa.

Work in progress to increase accessibility for the compensation program with software upgrades.

Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

Administrative funds were utilized to pay for partial salaries of staff that provide direct compensation services to victims.

8. Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

Effective with the new administration taking office on 1/1/2023, policy for payment of emergency contraception for victims of sexual assault through the Sexual Assault Examination Program has been under review for nine months. This policy review is impacting 217 victims for payments totaling around \$9,600 for the nine month period. In addition, the new administration is reviewing the policy to pay for specific medical treatment for victims of sexual assault through the Compensation Program, specifically the termination of a pregnancy in the event a victim conceives during the assault. At this time this is only impacting one victim seeking reimbursement through the Compensation Program.

9. Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

Our office strives to stay in constant communication with all aspects involved with victims of crime. The Victim Assistance Section also administers the VOCA Assistance grants funds, allowing for regular communication between the two teams for better client services.

Constant trainings and yearly conferences held by Victim Assistance. The training and outreach team has been increasing efforts of providing trainings and bein in the public eye. Partnerships have been growing between the Victim Assistance Section and County Attorney associations, Medical Associations, and the Department of Health and Human Services.
